Students enrolled only in Self-Paced Online Courses (correspondence). Courses sponsored by Online and Distance Education. *(Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98)*

4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.

1. All students enrolling in a course identified as one offered by Online and Distance Education.
2. Each student is counted only once regardless of the number of extension courses enrolled in during the full year.

Checks Totals = self-paced online course (correspondence) + extension. Duplicates are omitted.
Totals < self-paced online course (correspondence) + extension

Self-Paced Online Course (correspondence) totals = not in residence (page 1). Students also enrolled in residence work during the full year are omitted.

Self-Paced Online Course (correspondence) totals > not in residence (page 1).

The total hours for which all students are enrolled at the end of the second week (effective Fall 2004) of Fall/Spring semester, and the final enrollment of the summer session are determined. These are added together to determine the total hours for the year. Undergraduate hours are divided by 30 and graduate hours by 18 to determine a full-time equivalent.
